## Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding Plan - Swanton Morley VC Primary School

Academic year: **2021/2022**

Total fund allocated for this academic year: **£17,750**

### Key Objectives 2021/22:

- **Introduce the 'real PE' scheme** to facilitate more effective teaching, coverage and progression of the skills-based PE curriculum. This will include ensuring that enough curriculum time is allocated to PE in each Year group and that the hall is available to use every afternoon.
- PE coordinator **to ensure we access/deliver all appropriate training in relation to 'real PE'** and monitor the CPD needs of the staff
- As COVID restrictions are lifted, the school will need **to refocus on providing clubs** (before, during and after school) **and engaging in external sporting events**, primarily through utilising our WNDSSP membership. PE coordinator to monitor number/type of pupils who have taken part in these clubs & events
- **Improve and update the resources available in PE** lessons in order to provide children with the necessary tools to achieve the best possible outcomes across the PE curriculum. Some of these resources will also be made available at break & lunchtimes to encourage more sporting activities and practice of skills.
- **Train Yr6 pupils in being 'buddies'** so they can support and appropriately facilitate the games, sports and activities that other children want to take part in across the school day so that this embedded in school life (as soon as this is practicably possible due to C-19 restrictions).



**The desired 5 key outcomes from this funding are:**

- 1 – The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- 2 – The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- 3 – Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- 4 – Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- 5 – Increased participation in competitive sport

Replace football goals on the large field with: 16ft x 7ft Lift and Go Self-Weighted Football Goal Package	<p>The current goals have significantly deteriorated and are the wrong size &amp; type for primary aged children.</p> <p>In order to host competitive matches or tournaments against other schools and to give our children the best possible opportunity to participate and improve, these goals need to be replaced properly.</p> <p>This will also provide an opportunity for clubs to hire out the pitch in order to bring in extra revenue.</p>		<b>£2750</b>	
We will continue to use a proportion of our sports premium to staff the running of the pool, reflecting the extra sessions/opportunities for children at our school.	<p>Ensure our swimming instructor effectively supports the teaching of swimming for our pupils.</p> <p>As a result, the pupils' swimming activity is well over and above the National Curriculum requirements. 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	Swimming sessions, including before school, will continue to prepare pupils for competitive events and galas (both internally and externally) that give them an opportunity to demonstrate the level of expertise they have achieved due to the level of extra practice they receive at school.
