

Primary PE and Sport Premium Funding Plan - Swanton Morley VC Primary School

Academic year: 2023/2024

Total fund allocated for this academic year: £17,520

Key Objectives 2023/24:

- Consolidate the 'real PE' scheme to facilitate more effective teaching, coverage and progression of the skills-based PE curriculum. This will include ensuring that enough curriculum time continues to be allocated to PE in each Year group and that the hall is used every afternoon.
- PE coordinator to ensure we deliver all appropriate training/support in relation to 'real PE' and monitor the CPD needs of the staff, especially in light of new staff starting in January 2024.
- The school will need to continue to refocus on providing clubs (before, during and after school) and engaging in external sporting events, primarily through utilising our WNDSSP membership. PE coordinator to continue to monitor number/type of pupils who have taken part in these clubs & events
- To continue to improve and update the resources available in PE lessons in order to provide children with the necessary tools to achieve the best possible outcomes across the PE curriculum. Some of these resources will also be made available at break & lunchtimes to encourage more sporting activities and practice of skills.
- **To continue to maximise the use of our swimming pool** so that children get the opportunity to swim as much as possible and continue to do this even after they have achieved their required distances.



The desired 5 key outcomes from this funding are:

1 – The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
2 – The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement

3 – Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport

4 – Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils

5 – Increased participation in competitive sport

We plan to continue with our membership of the West Norfolk and Dereham School Sports Partnership (WNDSSP)	Our annual membership to the Sports Partnership ensures we have access to a large range of competitive events and makes sure pupils can access high quality sporting environments on a regular basis. The partnership provides competitive events that we will consistently access for all the year groups and gives our sports teams competitions to practice for and work towards. 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	The partnership also provides CPD opportunities that we utilise and effectively engage with. Their members can deliver training to our staff including specific, targeted support areas that have been identified in conjunction with our PE coordinator eg 'real PE'. The intention is that this will further develop the confidence and capability of class teachers in delivering high quality PE lessons.

	The HLTA with the PE specialism will work alongside class teachers and other Teaching Assistants to share good practice in delivering PE lessons and to develop the range of sports being taught. When the PE lead goes on maternity leave (January 2024) the HLTA will assume more responsibility for the leadership of PE.			
	We will focus on re-establishing the 'buddies' model, ensuring these pupil role models are effectively trained in outdoor games to engage younger pupils in fun physical activity.			
We will continue to use a proportion of our sports premium to staff the running of the pool, reflecting the extra sessions/opportunities for children at our school.	Ensure our swimming instructor effectively supports the teaching of swimming for our pupils. As a result, the pupils' swimming activity is well over and above the National Curriculum requirements.
